Małgorzata Malwina Niespodziewana

A graduate of the Academy of Fine Arts in Cracow (studies at the Faculty of Graphic Arts in the years 1993-1998, in 2007 she received her doctoral degree, and in 2017 her post-doctoral degree). Since 2013, she has been working as an adjunct professor at the Faculty of Art at the Pedagogical University of Cracow. She's teaching illustration classes. The body and feminism in art remains a constant point of reference for her work, in which she refers to biographies, texts and works of avant-garde artists, among others, to Katarzyna Kobro, Erna Rosenstein, Maria Jaremy (in 2017 she participated in the exhibition The Power of the Avant-Garde at the National Museum in Cracow). She created an artistic concept of a universal body, she combines various artistic fields, most recently: graphics, illustration, drawing and comics. Founder of MaMa Group and co-founder of Group 13 - female graphic designers. The author of thirty individual exhibitions, she took part in over one hundred and fifty group exhibitions in Poland and abroad. Winner of many awards and distinctions, among others, scholarship of the Minister of Culture and Art in 1997/8; The Mythological Europe Revisited in Italy; Creative City of Cracow scholarship in 1999, Mino Art Village Project in Japan in 2002 and 2006; in 2005, she was submitted to the Passports of Polityka weekly magazine for 2004, Grand Prix International Biennial of Graphics of The Baltic Sea Countries Kaliningrad - Königsberg in Russia in 2005. She lives and works in Cracow.

Anita Wincencjusz-Patyna

Art historian and critic, doctor of humanities in the field of art sciences. Assistant Professor at the Eugeniusz Geppert Academy of Fine Arts in Wrocław, Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Painting and Sculpture. Scholarship holder of Trinity College Dublin and International Jugendbibliothek in Munich. She cooperates with the Bratislava Illustration Biennale, the Croatian Illustration Biennale, the Municipal Gallery in Wrocław, the Baltic Sea Cultural Centre in Gdańsk, the Gallery of Modern Art Bunkier Sztuki in Cracow and other cultural institutions. Member of the Polish Section of IBBY (International Board on Books for Young People). Jury member of the national Good Pages competition in Wrocław and the international Picture Story Book Quadrennial in Riga (Latvia). Author of the book Stacja Ilustracja: Polska ilustracja książkowa 1950-1980. Artystyczne kreacje i realizacje (Wrocław 2008), Para-buch! Pociąg do ilustracji. Ewa Kozyra-Pawlak i Paweł Pawlak (2017), co-author of Look! Polish Picturebook (2016), a book also published as Polska szkoła książki obrazkowej (2017) and numerous articles in scientific journals devoted to illustration and book graphics, as well as the artistic community of Wrocław.

Nikola Kucharska

She was born the same year that Czechoslovakia broke up, Kapuściński published his novel

Imperium and Jerzy Owsiak founded the Great Orchestra of Christmas Charity. For most of her life she lived in Chorzów, although she currently travels between Siemianowice (where she lives), Katowice (where she studies) and Wrocław (where she intends to move). She became known as a prolific illustrator, an avid comic book creator, a novice board game illustrator and author of 10 books. After three and a half years of undergraduate studies, she graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Katowice with a bachelor's degree, but returned to her home university in the same year to continue her Masters studies. If she's lucky, she will graduate in 2018, for the second time, with a Master degree in graphic design, with a diploma in illustration. Among her own publications, she appreciates the most: Kobo in a supermarket (which she created in cooperation with Michał Kubas, publ. Tadam 2017), How does it work? Animals (Nasza Księgarnia, 2017), Greek myths for children in pictures (Nasza Księgarnia 2017), and nominated in the PTWK contest for the most beautiful book 2016 Journey around the world. North South. East West (Nasza Księgarnia 2016). She cooperates with many Polish publishers, including Tadam, Literatura, Media Rodzina czy Nasza Księgarnia, although most of her books are published by the latter. She occasionally works on various projects with companies and private clients. Her books were translated into over 6 languages and published in France, China, Russia and the Czech Republic. Privately, she's the owner of three black cats and one brownish. She's a passionate reader. She likes to sleep, watch TV shows and drink coffee in large quantities.

He collaborates with the Adam Mickiewicz Institute, the Zachęta National Gallery, the Book Institute, the Łódź Design Festival, Gdynia Design Days, the Museum of the City of Gdynia, the Regional Museum in Stalowa Wola, the Arsenal Gallery in Białystok, the Kielce Design Institute, Cieszyn Castle, the Polish Institute in Stockholm, Berlin, Budapest, STGU (Association of Graphic Designers), BWA in Wrocław, the National Institute of Museums and Collections Protection, EC1.
